Finally some snow! After some early snow in December, post Christmas weather brought rain and milder temperatures. The upside of this was that the rain created a well packed base that will stay for the months to come, the downside, of course, was that it delayed the opening of the SVSA trail system. SVSA trails were officially open on January 7th, 2006.

Pre-December 2nd sales of the OFSC/MTO Trail Permit for the SVSA increased this year from 319 (2004/2005) to 332, keeping us on target for 385 total permits sold for 2005/2006. Total permit sales for SVSA last year was 387.

Trail Permits

The fee schedule for the remaining 2005/2006 OFSC/MTO Trail Permits are as follows:

- \$230.00 - Season Permit
- \$100.00 – Seven day permit
- \$35.00 – One day permit

One-Day permits are available in limited quantities and are intended for the use of out-of-province visitors and special events. Trail Update

The SVSA asks all snowmobilers to STAY ON THE TRAIL or STAY HOME ! Every year we are faced with new challenges in keeping existing trails open due to snowmobilers not complying with the trail signs and markers.

Trails are marked where the SVSA has been granted permission by the landowner, any inappropriate usage or ‘cutting of corners’ may result in permanent closure of trail sections. Landowners also ask that snowmobilers refrain from stopping and/or causing excessive noise around homes and barns near the trail.

There are many aspects of our sport that are out of our control such as insurance, gas prices and the weather, but public perception and proper trail usage are our responsibility, let’s do our part well. Drive safe, sober and obey all signs!
